Training Profile

02 – 06 September, 2012

Introduction:

In response to a Request For Quotations issued by Save the Children International (SCI), Risalat Consultants International submitted a price quotation for conducting a five day training workshop on the subjects of Leadership, Project Management and HRM for the staff working in SCI's Urozgan Office and some other NGOs working in collaboration with SCI in Urozgan province. The offer was accepted by SCI and RCI prepared a tailor made training package covering the mentioned topics. Venue for the workshop was SCI's headquarters in Trinkot, Urozgan.

Training Delivery:

Total duration allocated for the training was five days i.e. from 02nd to 06th of September, 2012. SCI provided accommodation and transportation for the two trainers sent by SCI for conducting the training. Trainers assigned for this job are both well experienced and highly skilled, who have conducted similar trainings to a wide range of audiences in the past.

RCI believes in ensuring that the participants feel no barriers in their communication with the trainers during and after the training sessions. For this purpose, all the training materials for this training were prepared in Pashto language. This was made possible by RCI's expert translators who translated the standard training materials, acquired by RCI from international resources, in to Pashto language. Also the trainers assigned for this workshop were both native Pashto speakers. This facilitated the participants to get a clear understanding of the concepts discussed in the training and ask whatever questions they had during and after the training sessions.

Both the trainers utilized different training methodologies during the training in order to enable the participants gain maximum benefit from the workshop and also easily share their own knowledge and experience with other participants.

Workshop Evaluation:
